

- » Celebrated on the last Monday in September.
- » Started in New York City in 1882 to create a day for the “working class citizens.” It became a federal holiday in 1894. All states recognize it to this day.
- » This is the symbolic end of summer (and for the fashionistas – the end of wearing white pants and dresses.) The school year usually starts after this date in the States.
- » This holiday is celebrated with outdoorsy activities with family and friends.
